Also, if you have an emergency incident use the 911 phone number as well as your 911 address (the road you are on as well as the blue house number). This system works great and speeds up response times for all agencies. Some folks still have the old address numbers out on the homes and driveways and are using them, which can be confusing at times. It would be nice if all the old numbers were taken down. It would make things easier for us.

In closing we hope everyone has a safe and fun summer, whether you are a resident, cottager, guest or just passing through our piece of paradise.

Board Chairperson's Report

Happy Spring to all residents of PUFF's catchment area. We hope you had a good winter. To our seasonal residents, welcome back!

This report is an update on all the business and social aspects of our vibrant organization. Fire Chief Barry Bennett's report in this newsletter informs you of all the activities of PUFF'S Fire and Emergency Response Team.

We had another very busy year at PUFF. Last year we commissioned a capital needs assessment from an engineering consulting firm to determine what we need to preserve and enhance the great community asset that is the PUFF firehall / Pellatt Community Centre in Laclu. Using the recommendations of this report we applied for and received a second grant from the Northern Ontario Heritage Fund Corporation. As you will see from the accompanying photos, we have substantially improved the facilities at the hall. All our electrical panels were replaced to mitigate an identified fire hazard. The stairs in the fire hall were replaced to bring them to code. The floors in the men's and universal / handicapped washrooms were levelled to meet code, and all the washrooms were completely renovated and modernized, with motion sensor faucets installed to conserve water. All the floors in the community centre and washrooms were replaced with industrial quality flooring that should last decades. Permanent lines were painted on the community centre floor for the pickleball court. The dishwasher in the kitchen was replaced with a commercial quality unit. A three head split air heat pump was installed in the community centre to reduce heating costs and provide air conditioning in the hall. All the windows in the building are being replaced as many of them have broken seals in the sealed units. A new door is being installed in the

community centre, and the roofing over the entrance ways is being replaced to match the colour of the main roof. A new deck on the lake side of the community centre will greatly enhance the space for social events. A new storage shed has been installed beside the parking area to house the rescue snow machine and sled and the side by side ATV that we inherited from Lake of the Woods Search and Rescue. With these renovations, thanks to generous support from the NOHFC and the whole community, we will have invested

\$600,000 in upgrades over the last six years. (continued on page 3...)


